The Contracting Parties **HAVE AGREED** to the following terms and conditions including those in the following Annexes, which form an integral part of this sub-grant agreement.

General provision

The grant is awarded to *Sub-grant ProjectAcronym*, selected in the framework of the TASC-RestoreMed – Open Call, Type A: Community-led actions (CLA).

This agreement aims at defining the framework of rights and obligations of the Contracting Parties with respect to the Beneficiary's participation in the implementing the awarded project.



Article 1 - Entry into force and termination of the agreement

1.1. Entry into force

1. This Agreement enters into force on the day of its signature by the last Contracting Party.

1.2. Agreement termination

- 1. This Agreement will automatically terminate at the end date mentioned in Article 1.3.
- 2. Either Contracting Party can terminate the Agreement by written notice.
- 3. Termination has no effect on the provisions that normally continue to apply after the end of the TASC-RestoreMed funding Programme and duration of the Agreement.
- 4. F6S will be entitled to terminate the Agreement by written notice with immediate effect if the Beneficiaries do not fulfil their obligations. In this case, the provisions of Article 3 shall prevail.
- 5. In case pre-financing has been made and there is termination by the Beneficiaries, no additional payments will be made beyond the last concluded 'Stage'. Any subsequent work carried out before termination will be evaluated on an individual basis. F6S may request the refund of the pre-financing amount.

1.3. Duration and starting date of awarded the project

- 1. The effective starting date of the awarded **%Sub-grant ProjectAcronym%** is **xxx (full date)**.
- 2. The end date of the awarded "Sub-grant ProjectAcronym" is xxx (full date).
- 3. The %Sub-grant ProjectAcronym%, will be implemented for up to 24 months.
- 4. The implementation of the awarded project shall start on the date given above, even if the agreement has been signed at a later date.
- 5. The Beneficiaries will have access to limited information until the Agreement is signed.

Article 2 - Conflict of Interest

- The Beneficiaries shall take every necessary precaution to avoid any risk of conflict of interest relating with economic interests, political or national affinities, personal or any other interests liable to influence the impartial and objective performance of this project.
- 2. In case the Beneficiaries are involved in a conflict of interest or in a risk of conflict of interest, the Beneficiaries must formally notify this situation to F6S without delay and immediately take all the necessary steps to rectify this situation.





Article 3 - Breach of contractual obligations

- If the Beneficiaries breached any of the contractual obligations under this Agreement, the agreement may be terminated with immediate effect. In case of Force Majeure, the provisions of Article 8 shall prevail.
- 2. In the event of breach of the contractual obligations by the Beneficiaries, F6S reserves the right to withhold the payments, not to fulfil the payments to the Beneficiaries and the right to claim a refund of any already paid funds.
- 3. F6S will give written notice requiring that such a breach be remedied within 30 consecutive days. In case the Beneficiaries have not introduced remedies addressing the notice, F6S may decide to terminate the Agreement unilaterally. In case the Beneficiaries introduce remedies that are approved by F6S, the implementation must continue following the original timeline.

Article 4 - Project implementation and financial provisions

4.1 Maximum financial contribution

1. The maximum financial contribution to be granted to the Beneficiaries of the project is €xxxx (xxxx) and will be paid in the form of a lump sum.

4.2 Distribution of the financial contribution

- 1. The financial contribution will be paid in instalments after the Beneficiaries have fulfilled the necessary requirements of each Sprint of the project as stated in Articles 4.3 and 4.4.
- 2. F6S reserves the right to withhold the payments in case the Beneficiaries do not fulfil their obligations and consider the payment conditions for each stage.
- 3. Payments will be made in EUR. Banking and transaction costs related to the handling of any financial resources will be covered by the Beneficiaries.
- 4. Payments will be released no later than thirty (30) calendar days after the notification that the work associated with a particular Sprint has been approved. Any specific limitation delaying payments will be made known in advance.
- 5. The Beneficiaries are responsible for complying with any tax and legal obligations that might be attached to this Agreement.
- 6. Any additional conditions for payment may be specified in the Annex 1 Guide for Applicants_v1.x and Annex 1.1A Catalogue_Type A-Community-Led Actions_v1.x.

7. A Know Your Customer (KYC) check must be carried out before any payment. If the KYC check determines that additional information is required, the payment period mentioned in 'Article 4 - Project implementation and financial provisions' is reset until all additional information is received.

4.3 Project implementation

- The Beneficiaries will implement the awarded project in accordance with the provisions set out in Annex 1 Guide for Applicants_v1.x and Annex 1.1A Catalogue_Type A-Community-Led Actions_v1.x, and according to the project proposal.
- 2. The awarded project must submit the required reports corresponding to each Sprint within the dates specified in Annex 1 Guide for Applicants_v1.x and Annex 1.1A Catalogue_Type A-Community-Led Actions_v1.x.
- A review of submitted reports will be held within 30 calendar days of the end month of the Sprint. The objective of the review is to present the implemented Sprint and provide answers to questions from the mentors/coaches/reviewers and/or TASC-RestoreMed consortium.
- 4. If at any of the project stages the quality of work demonstrated and/or reported does not correspond to what has been agreed, F6S may agree to one resubmission of a report and respective reassessment. If significant improvements are not delivered after the reassessment, the sub-project is therefore considered to be in breach of their contractual obligations. Such breach will lead to measures described in Article 3.





4.4 Payments schedule

1. The payment schedule is directly linked to the relevant stages of the awarded project (sprints). The grant will be paid in instalments according to Table 2.

- 2. The payments will be disbursed once the work related to a specific stage has received positive assessment, based on the report submitted and respective review according to the Article 4.3.
- The payments will be made to the Consortium Lead no later than 30 calendar days, subject to completed KYC procedure and the duly completed submission of a Payment Request Form.
- 4. If the bank account details provided in the Payment Request Form are different from those submitted in the Bank Account Information form (Annex XX), a new form must be submitted accompanied by proof of ownership of the bank account with the name of the Consortium Lead (bank account statement or similar document). A new KYC procedure might be initiated by F6S in these cases.
- 5. If by law the Consortium Lead is required to send an invoice, it must include the following information: F6S Network Ireland Limited, 77 Lower Camden St., D02 XE80, Dublin, Ireland, VAT number: IE 3629141FH (F6S IE).

4.5 Records keeping

1. The Beneficiaries must keep for a period of five (5) years after the termination of the *Sub-grant ProjectAcronym* project, records and other supporting documentation which proves the proper implementation of the awarded project.





- 2. The Beneficiaries shall make the supporting documentation available upon request or in the context of checks, reviews, audits or investigations.
- 3. If there are on-going checks, reviews, audits, investigations, litigation or other pursuits of claims under the Agreement, the Beneficiaries must keep these records and other supporting documentation until the end of these procedures.
- 4. The Beneficiaries must keep the original documents. Digital and digitised documents are considered originals if they are duly recognised as such and/or admissible under the applicable national law. The <code>%Sub-grant ProjectAcronym%</code> project may accept non-original documents if they offer a comparable level of assurance.

4.6 Double funding

- The Beneficiaries acknowledge the fundamental principle underpinning the rules for public expenditure in the EU that no costs for the same activity can be funded twice from the EU budget.
- 2. The Beneficiaries undertake that all work performed under the %Sub-grant
 ProjectAcronym% project shall be carried out exclusively within the scope of this Agreement and shall not be supported or funded by any other EU budget line. The Beneficiaries shall use the awarded budget solely to cover activities directly related to the %Sub-grant ProjectAcronym% project. However, where specific activities exceed the available budget under this Agreement, the Beneficiaries may secure and utilize additional sources of financing, provided that such complementary funding is clearly distinguished from the sub-grant contribution and duly documented. In such cases, the Beneficiaries must ensure transparent allocation of costs, explicitly identifying in the project documentation which expenses are covered by the sub-grant and which are financed from other sources, thereby avoiding any risk of double financing.

Article 5 - Liability

5.1 Liability of the Beneficiaries

- 1. The Beneficiaries are fully responsible for the proper implementation of **%Sub-grant**ProjectAcronym% and in compliance with this Agreement.
- 2. Except in case of force majeure (Article 8), the Beneficiaries must compensate F6S for any damage they sustain because of the implementation of the obligations of the Beneficiaries under this Agreement or because the obligations were not implemented in full compliance with this Agreement.
- 3. The TASC-RestoreMed consortium or consortium partner cannot be held liable for any damage caused to the Beneficiaries or to third parties as a consequence of implementation of the Agreement, including for gross negligence.





- 4. The TASC-RestoreMed consortium or consortium partner cannot be held liable for any damage caused by the Beneficiaries or third parties involved in project implementation, as a consequence of implementation of the Agreement.
- 5. The Beneficiaries shall bear sole responsibility for ensuring that they act within the framework of this Agreement do not infringe third parties' rights.
- 6. There is no joint liability between the Contracting Parties. For this purpose, the Beneficiaries shall indemnify and hold F6S, and any TASC-RestoreMed consortium partner harmless from and against all repayments, loss, liability, costs, charges, claims or damages which F6S, any TASC-RestoreMed consortium partner or the European Commission (EC) as a result thereof would incur or suffer or must pay to the EC or any third parties.
- 7. In addition, should the EC have a right of recovery against the TASC-RestoreMed consortium regarding any or all the financial support granted under this Agreement, the Beneficiaries shall repay the sums in question in the terms and on the date specified by F6S.
- 8. The Beneficiaries' aggregate liability towards the other Contracting Party and the TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners collectively shall be limited to the Beneficiaries' maximum financial contribution as identified in Article 4.1.

5.2 Exclusions of liability

- 1. To the extent acceptable under applicable law, in no event shall the F6S or other TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners be liable to the Beneficiaries for loss or damage caused by F6S or the TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners, their employees, agents and subcontractors in connection with this Agreement for any of the following, however caused or arising, on any theory of liability, and even if F6S and/or any other TASC-RestoreMed consortium partner were informed or aware of the possibility thereof:
 - Loss of profits, revenue, income, interest, savings, shelf-space, production, and business.
 - Opportunities; lost contracts, goodwill, and anticipated savings.
 - Loss of or damage to reputation or to data.
 - Costs of recall of products.
 - Any type of indirect, incidental, punitive, special, or consequential loss or damage.
- In respect of any information or materials from the TASC-RestoreMed consortium made available to the Beneficiaries under this Agreement, no warranty or representation of any kind is made, given, or implied as to the sufficiency, error-free performance, or fitness for purpose, nor as to the absence of any infringement of any





proprietary rights of third parties. Therefore, in particular, but without limiting the foregoing:

- The Beneficiaries shall in all cases be entirely and solely liable for the use to which they put such information and materials, and the consequences of such use, and
- Neither F6S, the EC nor the other TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners shall be liable vis-à-vis the Beneficiaries in case of infringement of proprietary rights of a third party resulting from the Beneficiaries' use of the information and material.
- The exclusions and limitations stated in this Article and any other clause of this
 Agreement that has as its object or effect the exclusion or limitation of liability,
 shall not apply in respect of any: fraud; death, injury to natural persons or
 damage to real or immovable property caused by the negligence or wilful act,
 wilful misconduct, wilful breach; or otherwise in so far as mandatory applicable
 law overrides such exclusions and limitations.

Article 6 - Confidentiality

- The Parties shall protect confidential information of whatever nature or form as is disclosed between the Contracting Parties in connection with the sub-granted project. The information identified as confidential should be provided in writing.
- Specific rules and responsibilities regarding the use of confidential information shall be established in writing in a separate agreement, if needed. [For this case, a NDA template or similar will be prepared.]
- 3. F6S and TASC-RestoreMed Coordinator may disclose confidential Information to the EC and/or the other TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners if:
 - This is necessary to implement the GA or safeguard the EU's financial interests.
 - The recipients of the information are bound by an obligation of confidentiality.
- 4. The Beneficiaries agree and acknowledge that the EC shall be entitled to disclose confidential Information to its staff, other EU institutions and bodies or third parties, if:
 - This is necessary to implement the GA or safeguard the EU's financial interests.
 - The recipients of the information are bound by an obligation of confidentiality.
- 5. During the project implementation and for five (5) years following the ending of the TASC-RestoreMed on 31.08.2029, the Beneficiaries can not use any confidential information except as defined in this Agreement. The Parties will implement suitable measures to ensure confidentiality. The Parties will take the appropriate measures to guarantee the confidentiality of the information provided.





Article 7 - Intellectual property rights

- 1. The Beneficiaries acknowledge that all technologies, infrastructure and similar of the TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners are proprietary and owned by the respective partner or applicable third party.
- Nothing in this Agreement shall transfer to the Beneficiaries (or other partners they
 represent) any licence or other rights for the use of the tools, modules and similar that
 are property of a TASC-RestoreMed partner, unless a specific agreement is
 established.
- The results developed during the sub-granted project shall be exclusively the property
 of the Beneficiaries. This does not exclude the possibility for specific agreements to
 be made between the Beneficiaries and one or more of the partners of TASCRestoreMed consortium.

Article 8 - Force Majeure

- "Force Majeure" means any unforeseeable exceptional situation or event beyond the Contracting Parties control, which prevents either of them from fulfilling any of their obligations under the Agreement, which was not attributable to error or negligence on their part, and which proves to be inevitable despite the exercising of all due diligence.
- 2. Any default of a service, defect in equipment or material or delays in making them available, unless they stem directly from a relevant case of force majeure, as well as labour disputes, strikes or financial difficulties cannot be invoked as Force Majeure.
- 3. The Contracting Parties shall take the necessary measures to limit any damage due to Force Majeure. They shall do their best to resume the implementation of the action as soon as possible.
- 4. No Contracting Party shall be in breach of its obligations and tasks if such a breach is caused by Force Majeure. A Contracting Party will notify the other Contracting Party of any Force Majeure as soon as possible. In case the Beneficiaries are not able to overcome the consequences of Force Majeure within thirty calendar (30) days after such notification, F6S will decide accordingly, including the termination of the Agreement.

Article 9 - Information and communication

9.1 Information and communication towards the EC

- Throughout the duration of the sub-project, the Beneficiaries must promote the project and its results by providing targeted information to multiple audiences (including the media and the public), as well as participate in the TASC-RestoreMed promotion activities, in a strategic, coherent and effective manner.
- 2. The communication, dissemination activities and any infrastructure, equipment, vehicles, supplies or major result funded by the grant must acknowledge EU support





and display the European emblem, TASC-RestoreMed logo and include following disclaimer:

"The [sub-project acronym] project has received funding from EC through the TASC-RestoreMed (Grant Agreement no. 101217661)."

"Funded by the European Union. Views and opinions expressed are however those of the author(s) only and do not necessarily reflect those of the European Union or European Commission. Neither the European Union nor the granting authority can be held responsible for them."

- 3. Beneficiaries are authorized to use the European Union emblem in their communication materials strictly in accordance with the applicable EU visibility guidelines. In addition, beneficiaries may incorporate the ready-to-use visuals developed for the EU Mission 'Restore our Ocean and Waters,' provided that such materials are obtained through the designated channels and used in full compliance with the official guidance accompanying them.
- 4. Apart from the emblem and/or the EU Mission visuals, no other visual identity or logo may be used to highlight the EU support. When displayed in association with other logos (e.g. of beneficiaries or sponsors), the emblem must be displayed at least as prominently and visibly as the other logos without first obtaining approval. This does not, however, give the right to exclusive use. Moreover, the Beneficiaries may not appropriate the emblem or any similar trademark or logo, either by registration or by any other means.
- 5. F6S, the Coordinator, the TASC-RestoreMed consortium, and/or the EC shall be authorised to publish, in whatever form and on or by whatever medium, the following information: personal data, including the Beneficiaries' name, contact details, location, and project related information, for communication, publication and reporting purposes. This may also include, but is not limited to, using summaries, public deliverables, as well as any other material, such as pictures or audiovisual content/material provided by the Beneficiaries (including in electronic form).
- 6. The Beneficiaries shall make all efforts to ensure that all necessary authorisations for such publications have been obtained and that the publication of the information does not infringe any rights of third parties.
- 7. Upon a duly supported request by F6S, or by the Coordinator on behalf of the Beneficiaries, the EC may agree to forego such publicity if the disclosure of the information indicated above would risk compromising the Beneficiaries' security, academic or commercial interests.

9.2 Information and communication among the Contracting Parties

- 2. Any notice to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing, including e-mail communication, to the addresses and recipients listed above.
- 3. Any change of persons or contact details shall be notified immediately to the F6S. The address list shall be made accessible to all parties concerned.
- 4. The Beneficiaries must immediately communicate any changes in the control of the organisation, including any replacement or removal of legal representatives identified in the initial F6S-required KYC check. An updated KYC form along with proof of ID and residence must be provided to reflect the changes. Any pending payments may be suspended until the KYC is cleared.
- 5. Any communication will be conducted in English as the only official language of this Agreement.

Article 10 - Checks, reviews, investigation, audits

- 1. The EC may, at any time during the implementation of the sub-project and up to five years after the end of the sub-project, arrange for checks, investigation, reviews and/or audits to be carried out, by external auditors, or by the EC services themselves, including the European Anti-Fraud office (OLAF). The procedure shall be deemed to be initiated on the date of receipt of the relevant letter sent by the EC.
- 2. There will be no financial checks, reviews, or audits to check costs, since the Beneficiaries have no obligation to document the costs incurred for the action. Checks, reviews, and audits will focus on the technical implementation of the action.
- 3. In the event of registered delays, partial or insufficient implementation, or deviations from the approved proposal and/or proposed implementation plan of the project, F6S reserves the right to request from the Beneficiaries a financial report or any other appropriate form of financial justification for the costs incurred. Such documentation shall be provided upon request by F6S, within a reasonable timeframe as identified by





- F6S, following a pre-defined reporting/justification template by F6S and shall detail the expenditures relevant to the affected activities.
- 4. The Beneficiaries shall make available all information and data that may be requested by the EC or any representative authorised by it, to verify the compliance with sub-grant agreement.
- 5. To carry out checks, reviews, investigation, audits, the Beneficiaries shall ensure that the EC's services and any external body(ies) authorised by it have on-the-spot access at all reasonable times, notably to the Beneficiaries' offices, to its computer data, and to all the information needed to carry out those checks. They shall ensure that the information is readily available on the spot during an audit and, if so requested, that data be handed over in an appropriate form.
- 6. Based on the findings made during the check, a provisional report shall be drawn up. It shall be sent by the EC or its authorised representative to the Beneficiaries concerned, which may make observations thereon within one month of receiving it. The EC may decide not to take into account observations conveyed or documents sent after that deadline. The final report shall be sent to the Beneficiaries concerned within two months of expiry of the aforesaid deadline.
- 7. Based on the conclusions of the check, the EC shall take all appropriate measures which it considers necessary, including the issuing of recovery orders regarding all or part of the payments made by it and the application of any applicable sanction.
- 8. The European Court of Auditors shall have the same rights as the EC, notably right of access, for the purpose of checks and audits, without prejudice to its own rules.

Article 11 - Data protection

- 1. The Contracting Parties have the obligation to abide by the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation GDPR) of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons regarding the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data.
- 2. Each Contracting Party shall be considered a separate and independent data controller, as defined in the GDPR, to every other Contracting Party. The processing of personal data shall be carried out lawfully, fairly and in a transparent manner, collected for specific purposes and adequate, relevant, and limited to what is necessary in relation to the purposes for which it is processed. Where it might be designated by a relevant Supervisory Authority or through agreement between Contracting Parties that the TASC-RestoreMed partner handling the FSTP budget F6S and any other TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners are appointed as data processors, parties shall enter into appropriate data processing agreements as required by the GDPR.
- The Beneficiaries acknowledge that F6S and any other TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners, if appointed as data processors, are not responsible for the Beneficiary's compliance with any data protection or privacy law applicable to the Beneficiaries.





Each of the Contracting Parties, in their respective roles as data controllers, will be responsible for their own compliance with any data protection or privacy law applicable to them as data controller.

Article 12 - Miscellaneous

- Should any provision of this Agreement be or become invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement. In such a case, the Contracting Parties shall be entitled to request that a valid, legal, enforceable, and practicable replacement provision be negotiated which fulfils the purpose of the original provision.
- 2. The Beneficiaries shall not be entitled to act or to make legally binding declarations on behalf of F6S, the Coordinator or any other TASC-RestoreMed consortium partner, and nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to constitute a joint venture, agency, partnership, interest grouping or any other kind of formal business grouping or entity between the Contracting Parties or between the Beneficiaries and any TASC-RestoreMed consortium partner.
- 3. No rights or obligations of the Beneficiaries arising from this Agreement may be assigned or transferred, in whole or in part, and no obligations of the Beneficiaries may be subcontracted, without F6S' prior formal written approval; and such approval shall not exempt the Beneficiaries from any of its obligations hereunder. Subcontract of services must be (i) defined in the sub-grant project application; (ii) aligned with the purpose of the sub-grant project; (iii) not delivered by sub-grant project partnership. Subcontracting costs (of maximum 20%) for the action (including related duties, taxes and charges, such as nondeductible or non-refundable value added tax (VAT)) are eligible, if they are calculated on the basis of the costs actually incurred, fulfil the general eligibility conditions and are awarded using the beneficiary's usual purchasing practices provided these ensure subcontracts with best value for money (or if appropriate the lowest price) and that there is no conflict of interests.
- 4. Although (with exception to F6S) the TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners and their affiliated entities are not Contracting Parties to this Agreement, they are intended by the Contracting Parties to be third party beneficiaries under this Agreement and accordingly shall be entitled to enforce the terms of this Agreement against the Beneficiaries and (without limitation) shall be entitled to the benefit from, and to enforce any exclusion of limitation of liability of the TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners contained in this Agreement and any indemnity in favour of the TASC-RestoreMed consortium partners contained in this Agreement.
- 5. Amendments and modifications to the text of this Agreement require a separate written agreement to be signed between all Parties.
- 6. This Agreement is drawn up in English language which shall govern all documents, notices, meetings, and processes relative thereto.





Article 13 - Ethics

1. The Beneficiaries must implement the project line with the highest ethical standards and the applicable EU, international and national law on ethical principles.

Article 14 - Applicable Law

1. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of Ireland.

Article 15 - Settlement of disputes

- 1. If the Contracting Parties are unable to resolve a dispute amicably, such dispute will be finally settled under the Rules of Arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce by three (3) arbitrators in Ireland.
- 2. Nothing in this Agreement shall limit the Contracting Parties right to seek injunctive relief or to enforce an arbitration award in any applicable competent court of law.
